Opinion

The statement is prepared to assist the HABIB ULLAH SHEIKH (PVT) LIMITED to meet the requirements of the SECP, Pakistan Stock Exchange (PSX) and National Clearing Company of Pakistan Limited (NCCPL). As a result, the statement may not be suitable for another purpose. Our report is intended solely for HABIB ULLAH SHEIKH (PVT) LIMITED, SECP, PSX and NCCPL and should not be distributed to parties other than HABIB ULLAH SHEIKH (PRIVATE) LIMITED or the SECP, PSX or NCCPL. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
